

Dennis Madsen answered saying we can edit the LRTP, or Year 2040 plan, any time. He's right. Since the LTRP was adopted in March, the MPO added two projects!

The plan is a living document. Also, we're required to revamp and edit it entirely every five years. Plans change Because the county and cities change.



What's with all these plans?

The Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), commonly called the "Year 2040 Plan" is the main plan of the MPO. We also write the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

What's the difference?

- LRTP lists all transportation projects, both realistic & dreams, for Huntsville, Madison & Madison County for 25 years.
- The TIP lists all the funded, going-to-happen, projects for the next five years.

For a project to be in the TIP- and crews to start working- the project had to first be in the LRTP, so taxpayers know the MPO is doing the projects it planned to do. We update the LRTP every 5 years. See it online here: huntsvillempo.org/2040-plan

UPCOMING: Four bridges on Old Highway 431 in Hampton Cove will be replaced as part of the updated FY 2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program, (TIP). Greenway Master Plan & Greenway Focus Group

The Greenway Focus Group has a battle cry: "Finish the Greenway Master Plan!" As a government coalition, the MPO isn't designed to raise funds or rally volunteers. So, we're partnering with The Land Trust to do the

Interstate Updates

A safety improvement project will carry over to the 2016-2019 TIP for I-565:

Median Crossover Protection from Spring Branch in Limestone Co to Madison Blvd overpass. This 13.2 miles of improvements will ensure the safety of this corridor. The project is set to begin in May of 2017 and cost \$1.3 million dollars. For more info, ask: paige.colburn@huntsvilleal.gov



Public Transit : Move more people, reduce traffic congestion

The LRTP lists many public transit goals for the MPO area in the next 25 years. An electronic fare-box system for HSV, expansion of shuttle routes, and Saturday shuttle service are all visionary goals. Transportation Survey results are largely in favor of expanding public transit:

BIG Picture Huntsville conducted a Transportation Survey in April. The results show the public's positive opinion of public transit rather than expansion of car-based travel. This is great news for the future of public transit options in our MPO! Multi-modal corridors with rapid transit, like the 'complete street' image on the cover of this issue, were popular, as well. Old Monrovia Road- complete four lanes from Jeff Road to Providence. Currently, the 4 lane section, with a turn lane & sidewalks, ends about 1/2 mile west of the Providence Main traffic circle. This project will extend the four lanes to

Blake Bottom Road – From Jeff Road to Research Park Blvd. This project was changed from "visionary" to "financially constrained" in the LRTP. This means the project has moved up in priority and funding will be found for it. In the LRTP,

Aldridge Creek will be extended from Weatherly Road north to Esslinger Road. Construction to begin in 2017.
