

MPO OVERVIEW



The Huntsville Area MPO, formally known as the Huntsville Area Transportation Study (HATS), was established in the 1970s by the Governor of the State of Alabama. The HATS/MPO operates under a signed agreement concerning the transportation planning process for the Huntsville Urbanized Area. The agreement, updated in 1995 and signed by Madison County; the municipalities of Huntsville, Madison, Owens Cross Roads, and Triana; the State of Alabama; and the Top of Alabama Regional Council of Governments, indicates that the <u>Huntsville Urbanized Area</u> will carry out a 3-C (cooperative, comprehensive, and continuing) transportation planning process. This is imperative, so that coordination with the planned development of the Huntsville Urban Area can occur, and so that the designated jurisdictions can qualify for federal funding assistance for transportation improvements. The agreement underwent several changes. Then, finally in December 2015, the agreement was updated and adopted with considerations for the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act.

ABOUT THIS REPORT

Background and Purpose

As the designated metropolitan planning organization for the region, the MPO is required by Federal law to prepare a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to indicate how the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) will be implemented. Preparation of the TIP is required by federal legislation known as Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (Pub. L. 114-94, FAST) and by the Metropolitan Planning Regulations (23 CFR 450.326) of the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT). The MPO's current TIP covers the Fiscal Years 2020-2023, from October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2023 and provides a prioritized list of multimodal transportation projects within the Huntsville Area MPO Region.

The current transportation bill, FAST Act, requires the MPOs to publish an Annual Listing of Obligated Projects (23 CFR 450.334) for which funds have been obligated in the preceding year as a record of project delivery and a progress report for public information and disclosure. In addressing FAST Act requirements, this report lists all transportation projects in the Huntsville Area MPO's Planning Area that were obligated during Fiscal Year 2021 (October 1, 2020 - September 30, 2021).

What are project obligations?

One might think of this as setting up a checking account for a purchase and then making an initial deposit. In order to begin work on any phase of a transportation project, federal funds must be obligated. This means that money is set aside for that particular project (deposited in the "checking account" for the project), which can then be used to pay bills. The project expenses may cover invoices from a design consultant, a construction contractor, or payroll costs for agency employees working on the project.

Do project obligations mean the work is underway?

Not always. Project obligations are made to allow a project phase to begin, but it takes time to get work underway once the phase is obligated. For example, once the construction phase is obligated, the project can then be advertised for bids. The advertisement period can vary depending on the size and complexity of the project (up to five weeks in some cases). Bids are then opened, evaluated and the project awarded to a contractor. This process can create a three to four-month lag between initial obligation and noticeable work performed by the contractor at the site.

There are instances when a project phase is obligated, but work is never started or not completed in a timely manner; these are generally due to competing priorities with the project sponsor. If there is a question on the status of a specific project, the project sponsor should be contacted.

Project Listing

The following tables list projects that had federal funds obligated during FY 2021 (October 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021) and identifies the phases for which those funds were obligated. The tables are split into two parts: FHWA funded projects and FTA funded projects, and includes basic data about each project:

- **Program:** The Federal Aid program used to fund the project.
- <u>Table Number (Table No.)</u>: This is the location of the project based on project type and funding.
- Federal Aid Number (FA Nbr.): Number assigned to the project based on the Federal Aid program used to fund the project.
- **Project Number:** Assigned by the state DOT to identify and track the project. Each phase of the project has its own project number.
- **Scope:** This describes the phase or type of work to be performed and for which funding was obligated. Only those phases that had funds obligated during the FFY are listed. Below are phases included in the table:
 - 1. Preliminary Engineering (PE)
 - 2. Right of Way (ROW)
 - 3. Utilities (UT)
 - 4. Construction (CN)
 - 5. For Maintenance (FM)
- Length: The linear distance of the project measured in miles.
- Start Date: Date work is expected to start or did begin.
- Type of Work: Description of the improvements or work to be completed
- <u>% Engineers Estimate</u>: Project cost estimate
- Federal Obligated: Amount of federal dollars obligated to the project
- Federal Expenditure: Amount of federal dollars spent to date on the project.
- **Balance:** Amount of federal dollars remaining in the budget for the project

Please note that the list of FTA funded projects does not identify individual phases as shown for FHWA funded projects; this is because most transit agencies use funds to purchase capital equipment and do not use the funds to build infrastructure projects, as done with the highway program.

SUMMARY OF OBLIGATED PROJECTS 2021

For FY 2021, project sponsors obligated \$22.4 million in federal transportation funding for a variety of State, County, and local transportation projects in Huntsville Area MPO region. This included over \$1.1 million in FTA funding for transit projects.
